**ANNOUNCEMENT FROM BISHOP JOHN STOWE
To St. Julian and St. Anthony Parishes**

Fr. Jesuraj has been recalled to his religious congregation, The Heralds of Good News based in India, because he has been in the diocese longer than their congregation permits a priest to work in a particular diocese outside of their country.

Fr. Jesuraj very much wanted to remain in Middlesboro and Pineville and has worked to extend his time in the Diocese of Lexington and would eventually like to join the diocese as a diocesan priest. But at this time the congregation will assign him somewhere in India and we do not know for how long. Bishop John will be working to find a priest who can serve the communities of St. Julian and St. Anthony. Middlesboro and Pineville has been through too may pastoral transitions lately and hopefully a pastor who can minister for a full term can be found soon.

He further states, “The CCHD collection is an important opportunity to support the national anti-poverty program of the U. S. By using solar power and backup batteries, the response centers can continue operating in the event of power loss—but they will also be using clean, renewable energy rather than fossil fuels that contribute to climate change and pollution.
